

1st and Runners-up prizes to be won for Grade 3, Grade 4, Grade 5 and Grade 6, announced at 2nd assembly in Term 2.








Dear Principal/Teachers/Parents/Guardians

During term 2 all students registered with Transport for NSW for SSTS travel will be issued with a student bus pass. This card will have the bus route number that your student/child is registered to travel on. They will be refused travel on any other service unless prior permission is given by Canns Bus Lines by requesting and completing a permission slip.

Please advise our office if your child has lost their card, or their card has incorrect information.

The SSTS (School Student Transport Scheme) with Transport for NSW is for travel TO your registered school from your home residential address and then FROM your registered school back to your registered home address or nearest allocated stop.

Under no circumstances will students be collected from anywhere other than THEIR REGISTERED SCHOOL, they will not be picked up from a nearby school, local shop etc.

Attached is a copy of the Student Code of Conduct – please take the time to read this and advise your students of this information. If your child/student is in breach of this code, their Bus Pass and right of travel will be reviewed.

Code of Conduct for School Students on a school bus. It is every student's responsibility to behave in a manner that ensures the safety and comfort of passengers and drivers. This includes:

Behaviour on buses

- Use appropriate language not offensive or racist language, no swearing.
- · Fighting, spitting, feet on seats, throwing things in or from the bus is not permitted
- No eating or drinking (other than water) unless for medical reasons or the bus operator gives written permission.
- No Smoking or Vaping whilst travelling on the bus
- Do not push or shove other people
- Do not bully or harass other passengers or the driver
- Avoid attracting the attention of the driver except in the case of emergency
- Do not take photos or record video or audio on a mobile phone or post to social media without bus operators consent.

Do not play music at such volume that it may distract the bus driver or other passengers.

Safety on and near buses

- Obey reasonable directions from the driver (e.g. where to sit or to remain in the bus)
- · Remain in your seat do not move around the bus
- · Keep bags and other items clear of the aisle
- Do not allow any part of your body to protrude out of the bus at any time
- Wait for the bus in a quiet and orderly manner including at bus interchanges
- Stand away from the roadside until the bus comes to a complete stop
- Allow other passengers to leave the bus before stepping onto the bus in a single line
- Wait until the bus stops before moving to get off the bus at your designated stop

Cross the road where and when it's safe to do so, use crossings/traffic lights where available.

Legal considerations on buses


- Wear the seat belt properly adjusted
- Obey the law that bans smoking and vaping on buses
- Ensure that buses are not vandalised report any damage, e.g. graffiti and window etching, to the driver
- · Do not interfere with bus property, equipment and signage

Do not leave rubbish on the bus, or at bus stops or interchanges.

Disobeying these rules may lead to the withdrawal of bus travel, banning students from travelling on buses and/or police prosecution and court action.
