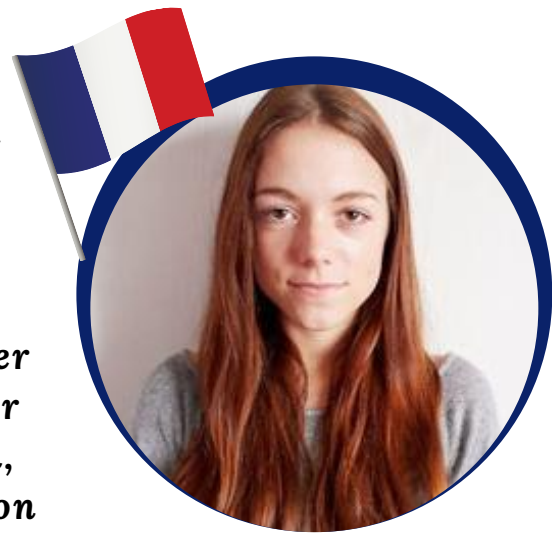

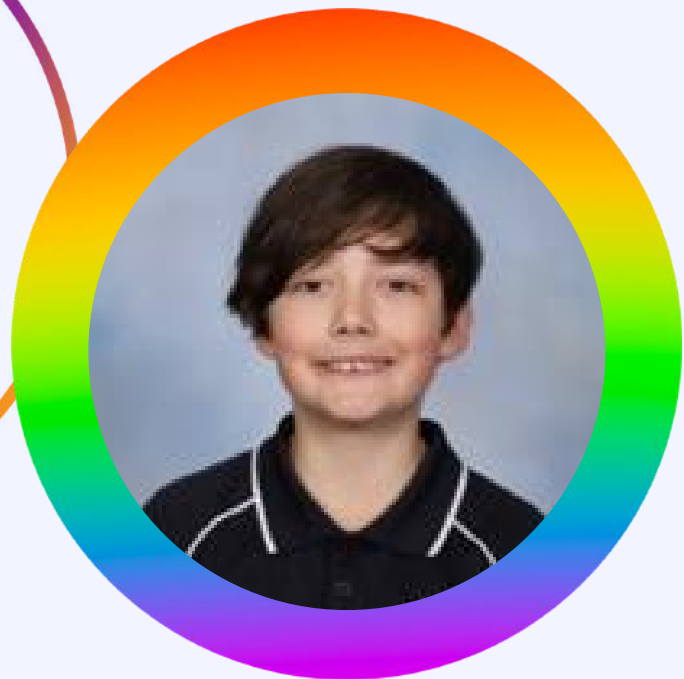

# What is STEM?

Stem is a combination of Science and Technology. STEM is covered across the year in 4 different topics e.g. This term all students will be exploring Biological Science, Term 2 Earth Sciences, Term 3 Chemical Science and Term 4 Physical Science. Topics at each level are covered over a 2-year period.

Technology is incorporated into these areas and where possible through workshops from experts outside the school.

For example-Next term the in Science the focus in Year 5 and 6 will be Natural disasters. Their Technology problem will be to plan and build a model of a house with features to withstand a natural disaster and explain their design.

Last week the 5-6 classes had to simulate cold conditions and the difference blubber makes to the animals being able to adapt there. There were lots of gasps as children enjoyed putting their hands in Ice water with or without dripping!



## ART

Foundations to Year 2 planted seeds in their caterpillars to assist them to understand the Life Cycle of a plant. We are hoping that very soon we will have some hairy caterpillars.

Year 3-4 used plasticine to create some wonderful Life Cycles of plants and animals to further their understanding of this process.

In Art 5-6 explored 3 techniques to create special affects with paint to create abstract art using scraping with card, texture combs and Splatter platters. They particularly loved being able to apply the paint with their hands.
