Tues 2nd Dec - Current Foundation - Year 5 & 2026 Foundation - 9am- 12:45pm

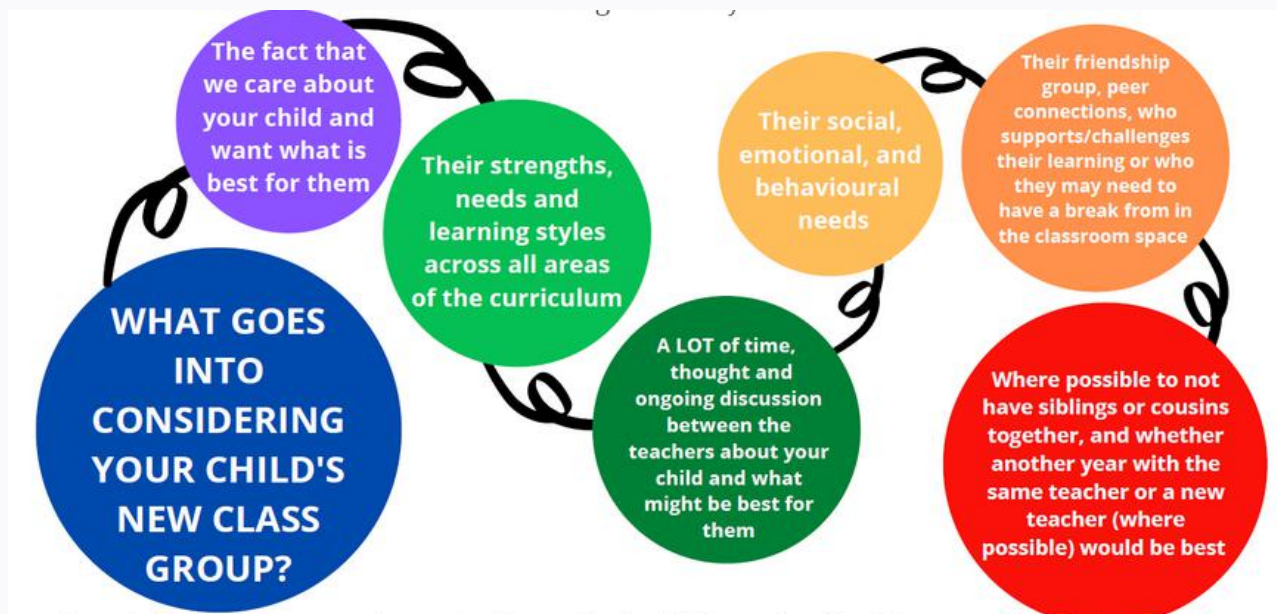
Tues 9th Dec - Current Foundation - Year 6 & 2026 Foundation - 9am- 3:30pm

Every year we run 2 whole school transition days. These sessions provide students the opportunity to 'step up' and experience their new year level, meet their teachers, ES staff & classmates.

Throughout the day, students complete a range of fun and engaging activities designed to ...

- build new and extend on existing connections and understandings of each other
- give teachers the opportunity to observe student's skills and dispositions e.g., team building, confidence, creativity, school values
- learn about students' interests and passions, strengths and challenges, likes and dislikes, what they are looking forward to moving into the next year level and any worries they might have
- ask questions about anything they want to know about

WHAT'S NOT DIFFERENT FROM F-6 ... our school values and behaviour expectations (flowcharts), our models/structures of how we go about teaching & learning, that all staff already know all our kids and have great connections with so many, specialist classes, our focus on wellbeing and all the other fun stuff that happens all the time, that your child matters to each and every one of us.

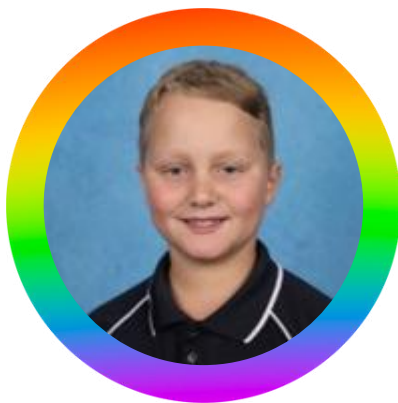
STEM

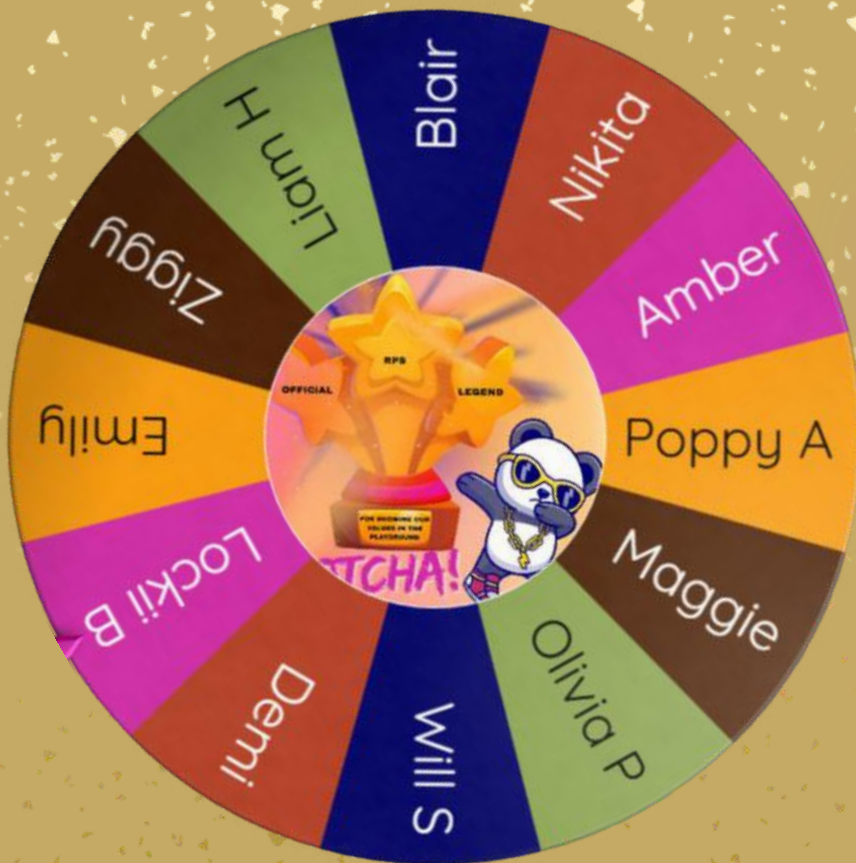

In all Victorian government schools, smoking and vaping are banned on all school premises and within four metres of any pedestrian entrance.

This ban applies to everyone, including students, staff, parents, and visitors, and covers all school activities, including those held off-site.

The policy extends to all forms of smoking and vaping, including cigarettes, e-cigarettes, and vapes, regardless of nicotine content.

What is banned:

- Smoking cigarettes or using e-cigarettes/vapes on school grounds
- Smoking or vaping within 4 metres of any school entrance
- Smoking or vaping at school-sanctioned events or excursions, even if they are held off school grounds
